#### **EXECUTIVE ORDER 007 - 2023**

## AN ORDER ESTABLISHING THE TERRITORIAL BROADBAND COORDINATION, OPPORTUNITIES, REDEVELOPMENT AND DEPLOYMENT OFFICE, ESTABLISING THE BROADBAND STEERING COMMITTEE, AND REPEALING EXECUTIVE ORDER 006-2023

#### Section 1: Authority

This executive order is hereby issued in accordance with the powers and authority granted to the Governor by Article IV, Sections 6 and 7 of the Revised Constitution of American Samoa, and the American Samoa Code Annotated, Section 4.0111 (b).

#### Section 2: Preamble

WHEREAS, access to broadband is essential to the prosperity and quality of life of everyone living in American Samoa;

WHEREAS, broadband is vital to commerce, the economic vitality of communities, and American Samoa's global competitiveness;

WHEREAS, President Biden announced the \$42.45 billion Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program which enable States and Territories to expand high-speed internet access by funding planning, infrastructure deployment and adoption programs in furtherance of the Administration's "Internet for All" initiative;

WHEREAS, broadband is vital to the delivery of education, health care, transportation services, public safety, emergency response, and other critical services;

WHEREAS, broadband is vital to creating an inclusive infrastructure that addresses the needs of people with disabilities, the elderly, minors and the community as a whole;




## **BCORD OFFICE**



### American Samoa to Receive Over \$37 Million for High Speed Internet

"These investments into high-speed internet will help close the digital divide and get our people closer to competing on equal footing. Education, healthcare, job creation, and economic opportunities all received a big boost today."

The United States Department of Commerce's National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) today announced it has allocated funding to all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and five territories to deploy affordable, reliable high-speed Internet service to everyone in America. American Samoa stands to receive \$37,564,827.53 from this program. This "Internet for All" initiative is a key component of President Biden's "Investing in America" agenda.

"What this announcement means for people across the country is that if you don't have access to quality, affordable high-speed Internet service now – you will, thanks to President Biden and his commitment to investing in America," said Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo. "This is a watershed moment for millions of people across America who lack access to a median ted Internet connection. Access to Internet service is necessary for work, education, head and more," said Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Communication and Inform Davidson.

# **Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment (BEAD) Program?**

- Funded by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, BEAD is a federal grant program that aims to get all Americans online by funding partnerships between states or territories, communities, and stakeholders to build infrastructure where we need it to and increase adoption of highspeed internet.
- BEAD prioritizes **unserved** locations that have no internet access or that only have access under 25/3 Mbps and **underserved** locations only have access under 100/20 Mbps.
- Funding allocated to states and territories are designed to be subgranted to eligible sub-grantees.






### Timeline for BEAD

# Funding pool \$2.75B

Three programs that provide funding to promote digital inclusion and advance equity for all. They aim to ensure that all communities can access and use affordable, reliable high-speed Internet to meet their needs and improve their lives.

#### **PROGRAMS HIGHLIGHTS**

#### The Digital Equity Act created three programs:

#### State Planning

 \$60M formula funding program to develop digital equity plans

#### State Capacity


 \$1.44B formula funding program to implement plans
 & promote digital inclusion

#### Competitive

 \$1.25B to implement digital equity and inclusion activities

#### **Example eligible uses of funds include:**

- Developing digital equity plans; states must develop a plan to be eligible for state capacity grants
- Implementing digital equity plans and related activities
- Making awards to other entities to help make digital equity plans
- Providing digital literacy and digital skills education
- Improving accessibility and inclusivity of public resources
- Facilitating the adoption of high-speed Internet



### **Digital Equity Funding Overview:**

#### Select Digital Equity programs details

Three federal grant programs

- State Planning Program: A \$60M formula grant program for states, territories, and tribal governments to develop digital equity plans.
- State Capacity Program: A \$1.44 billion formula grant program for states, territories, and tribal governments. It will fund an annual grant program for five years in support of digital equity projects and the implementation of digital equity plans.
  - Note: US territories other than Puerto Rico and Tribal / Native entities have separate funding allocations and different programmatic requirements for the State Planning and Capacity Programs

The DE program funding focuses on the lack of access to affordable and reliable highspeed internet for certain covered population groups:

Matching Requirement: No matching required

### **Target Groups:**

- 1. Low-income households
- 2. Aging populations
- 3. Incarcerated individuals
- 4. Veterans
- 5. People with disabilities
- 6. People with language barriers
- 7. Racial and ethic minorities
- 8. Rural inhabitants

## **Potential Projects:**

- 1. Develop, implement and oversee digital equity plans
- 2. Sub-awards to help develop digital equity plans
- 3. Improve accessibility and inclusivity of public resources
- 4. Implement digital equity plans
- 5. Digital literacy and skills education to covered populations
- 6. Facilitate the adoption of high-speed internet by covered populations


- Planning Funds \$150,000 awarded June 1, 2023 to:
  - Develop the Territory
     Digital Equity Plan;
  - Conduct data collection and analysis, digital inclusion asset mapping and stakeholder engagement;
  - Staff recruitment and development
- Designed to be sub-granted to ELIGIBLE ENTITIES

## **Actions and Next Steps...6 months**

- Submit 5 Year Action Plan and Digital Equity Plan American Samoa is taking a complementary approach to create both our Digital Equity Plan and BEAD 5-Year Action Plan.
  - 5 YEAR ACTION PLAN due August 1, 2023
  - DIGITAL EQUITY PLAN due one year after grant award
- Submit allocations for Initial Proposal due by December 2023
- Begin (estimated) acceptance of sub-grantees proposals -January 2024 (upon approval of Initial Proposal and complete of challenge process)
- Release (tentative) funding to sub-grantees:
  - OBEAD: January June 2024
  - Digital Equity: June 2024 December 2024
